ACCESSIBILITY Although Ronda is a walled city built on a rocky plateau precisely because of its inaccessibility and, therefore, because of its strategic, military and tactical advantage in the face of an enemy invasion at the time of its foundation, today these spaces have an incredible tourist value due to the spectacular views thanks to their dominance over the landscape. Taking the original route of the historic path as a starting point, accessibility has been significantly improved by incorporating a non-slip stone pavement and the introduction of steps that reduce the original slope by approximately 5-7%. SUSTAINABILITY In this project, priority has been given to the use of local materials and traditional construction techniques. The main material used is stone from the Asa de la Caldera Arroyo del Toro, a local quarry. The viewpoints in strategic places have been made with natural wood, in this case iroko, on a pine wood substructure.
